Principal's Message



Polyfest is on Friday and we just can't wait! Seeing the quality of the performances happening all over school, this is going to be an outstanding year. We are the host school so will not be running any classes on the day. There will be several options for students:

- Most of our students are performing and we will take them in a bus. Performers need to be here at 8.20am to get on the buses. They need to be in uniform.
- We know lots of you are planning on coming along to watch, bringing your rangatahi with you. Please let us know if your child won't be at school on the day because they are coming with you. If they are not performing and attending under your supervision, they don't need to wear uniform at polyfest.
- Students who want to come into school will have a choice of watching the live stream or doing independent learning, supervised by teachers. They need to wear uniform.

We know this is going to be an outstanding day in which our students proudly celebrate their cultures in a festival of dance. Seniors will be gaining credits and everyone will be standing strong on their turangawaewae.

On Tuesday 23rd August at 3.15pm we are inviting all families to come and join us to start planning our 2023 -25 Strategic Plan.
