CACTUS was first introduced at Porirua College in 2016. It stands for Combined Adolescent Challenge Training Unit and Support and is led by the Porirua Police Youth Team in collaboration with Porirua College, with support from the Porirua Healthy Safer City Trust, Porirua City Council, and Partners Porirua. The programme is designed to challenge and develop a young person's mental and physical capabilities, with a focus on teamwork, goal setting, leadership, and discipline. This year, for the first time, three Porirua College students are returning to the programme as student mentors.



Over the past eight weeks, students have committed to arriving at 5:30 am three days a week to complete physical training, army drill (marching), team-building activities, and listen to guest speakers. Each student also selects and shares an inspirational quote as part of the programme. The programme will culminate with the "Longest Day" on Saturday, 12th April. This twelve-hour event will be filled with a series of physical, mental, and group challenges designed to push their limits.

School Parking for Students

If your tamariki drives a car to school, they must have at least a restricted license and complete the Student Driver's Form, which is available at the office. Once the form is returned, it will be scanned, along with their license, and stored in our school records. A pass will then be issued, which must be displayed on the dashboard of their car while parked on school grounds. There will be designated parking spaces for student vehicles.

Please note that students are not permitted to leave school grounds during the day, so they should not drive out during school hours. Student drivers must also adhere to the conditions of their license: learners cannot drive to school, and those with a restricted license are not allowed to have other students in the car.
